Eric Patterson, Ph.D., is a professor in the Robertson School of Government at Regent University and served as dean from 2012-2018, before he voluntarily stepped down to get married last summer. He previously was a professor at Georgetown University and is the author or editor of thirteen books on foreign policy and the ethics of war. He is a regular speaker for government audiences, from U.S. Central Command to the U.S. Air Force Academy to the Foreign Service Institute. Patterson has considerable U.S. government experience.
